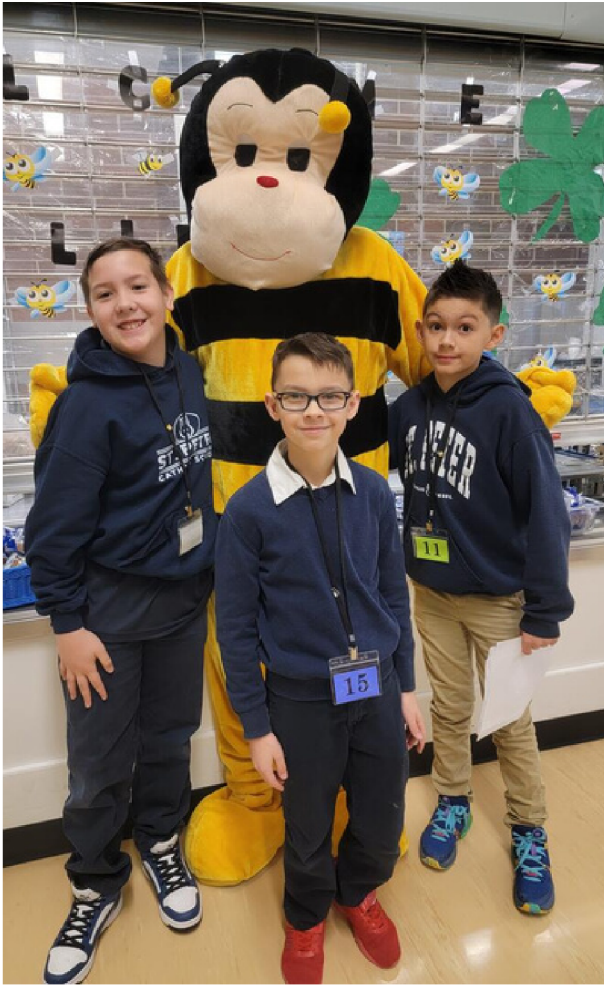

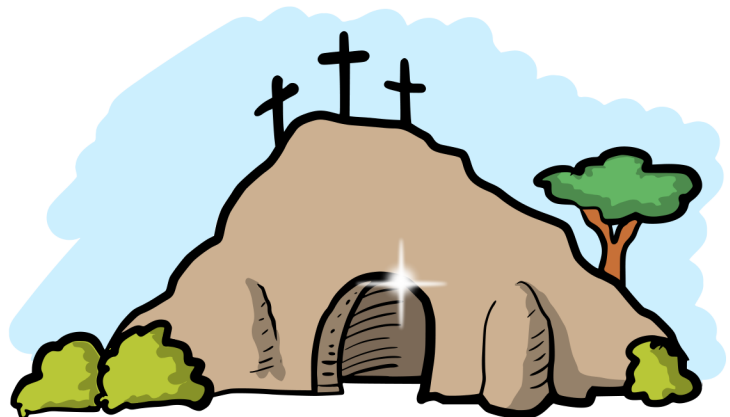
NOT-SO-MAD SCIENTISTS



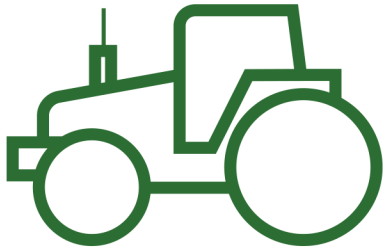
